Mrs. Reynolds has already put forward some proposals for the outside space of St Peter and St Paul's RE block, which were warmly welcomed by Mr. Bazen and Mrs. Ridley. Mrs. Reynolds suggested that an area could be developed properly by a garden designer that she knows well, and she is proposing to develop the area as a garden space for the environmental group to be fully involved in this project. This is going to bring a new perspective to Catholic Social teaching and stewardship, and it will be a fantastic project for our pupils to be a part of in the future.

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3. Religious Education

Diocesan Inspection 'Outstanding'

We have recorded our Mock grades from Y10 pupils and completed reports across the other year groups. We shall be catching up with parents this week for various appointments as indicated by Mr. Rooney in his weekly report.

All of our Y10 RE pupils have been focusing on Creation and Eschatology during their latest Mock examinations, as you are aware from my previous report, and we have begun our Assessment For Learning work around the mock exams.

We identified one third of pupils had very positive results with their FFT20 targets being met; however, two thirds of the pupils found the mock exams a real challenge and their overall grades did not meet their FFT20 targets. During the data analysis of the exams, we identified that the most positive results were from the Eschatology paper, which was one of the latest topics we studied (and continued to study throughout lockdown), and it is pleasing to see some very positive grades in this topic. It is important to note that the very first topic our Year 9 pupils studied at the start of the GCSE course was the one they found the most challenging. This shows us just how important revision and interventions will be next year in order to achieve a greater balance and the grades our pupils are clearly capable of achieving.

We have continued with RSE programme from TenTen and Cinema in Education. This programme is coming to an end this week and we'll have an evaluation of the programme to be given to the pupils at the end.

The RE department will be continuing with the usual Schemes of Learning from September. Mr. Blaho will be introducing to the Department the new Diocesan Initiatives that have been discussed at the latest meeting with Mrs. White, our RE Advisor from Clifton Diocese. Mrs. White shared with Mr. Blaho the New Curriculum Directory proposals as they will be shortly approved by our Bishop Declan.

Finally, I would like to thank you all for your continuous support of our Catholic education and everything you do to promote our school's Catholic Ethos.
