

Dear Parent/carer,

I can't believe that we've only got two school weeks left until we break up on Friday 23rd July! This year has certainly had its challenges but it has absolutely flown by! In the last week of term, we'll be hosting the School's Sports Day and House Competition Day as well as virtual awards assemblies and the famous school house quiz!

We're doing all we can to ensure that all members of our staff and student body can remain in school until the end of term and take part in these enrichment activities with regular cleaning of rooms, the use of hand sanitiser and keeping the bubbles as separate as possible. We've also taken the decision this week to revert back to online assemblies as, the last thing we want to have to do, is send a whole year group bubble home.

As you will have seen from earlier correspondence this week, we were instructed to send 40 pupils home to self-isolate for 10 days. Any such decision has to be done in consultation with Public Health England and we are obliged to follow this as part of the Government expectations to seek to reduce and break the chain of transmission, and especially with the new, much more virulent Delta strain.

Please continue to carry out the weekly lateral flow tests and follow the guidance of handwashing and social distancing. We really do hope this is the last time we'll have to do this, but we're only far too aware of the increase in local cases so urge you all to do all you can to keep the virus at bay as restrictions are being relaxed.

We'd also like to remind families that if your child has been asked to self-isolate that you should be following the government guidance and not leaving your house.

Year 9 Holocaust Memorial

On Thursday this week, Year 9 students were off timetable during the morning so that they could engage in learning about the Holocaust. It is a statutory requirement from the Department for Education that all students in England and Wales learn about the Holocaust before the end of Year 9. St Joseph's students usually study it in Year 8, but we felt it was not an appropriate subject matter for remote learning for them last year. All sessions were be delivered by qualified History and RE teachers in an engaging and respectful manner and the pupils handled the sensitive nature of the Holocaust very maturely. Many were shocked at the devastation and brutality of Holocaust and also moved by the personal stories they were exposed to.
