Key Stage 3

- Varied curriculum with 14 different subjects being studied
- Options made halfway through Year 9

Key Stage 4

Detering the negative Behaviour Points

- Antagonising another student
- Refusal to work
- Damage
- Disrupting the learning of others
- Not equipped to learn
- Missing detentions
- Using phones
- Late to lesson
- Theft
- Uniform including jewellery
- Inappropriate comment/action to teacher





Accumulating Points

Accumulating points will result in a number of actions and interventions taking place depending on the number of points accumulated.

All actions will be taken with a view to reforming undesired behaviour.

These can consist of:

- Detentions
- Phone call home
- Parent meetings
- Periods on report
- A period in isolation
- Fixed term exclusion

All this has been designed so that your child can do their best!

- We are providing a caring, nurturing and safe environment, with a culture of academic challenge to enable all our students to achieve their potential.
- You will be kept informed of achievement and behaviour points on a daily basis through our parent portal – letters will be distributed in September.
