

Dear Parents/Carers,

URGENT: COVID Testing Procedures and Guidance

In our efforts to protect the St Joseph's Catholic School community we must please ask that parents read the following guidance regarding students with COVID symptoms and when to get a PCR test.

When should my child get a PCR test?

If your child is experiencing symptoms of Covid; raised temperature, cough or loss of taste or smell, you must book a PCR test as soon as possible and your child should remain at home until you receive the results. **Please be aware that if your child is experiencing one of these symptoms it is not sufficient to administer a Lateral Flow Test (LFT).**

How will this impact my child's attendance?

If your child displays one of the above symptoms and is isolating awaiting a PCR result, they will be coded in the school register as an X code. This is not classed as absent and so will not negatively impact your child's attendance record. This is a provision put in place by DfE and UK Government to help ensure parents are not deterred from getting a PCR test when their child displays symptoms.

Additional guidance

In addition, as we work to keep the St Joseph's Community as safe as possible, we would advise the following: If your child is suffering from a sore throat, headache, upset stomach or cold/flu symptoms, and these symptoms are severe enough that your child cannot attend school, we would advise that you to book a PCR test. Your child is not required to isolate whilst awaiting the results of this test and should attend school as soon as they are able.
