OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST King of the Universe

From Father Anthony...

It was a lovely light, airy day. Leaves hopped and skipped down the street chased by a gentle breeze. Cars stopped and started as traffic lights competed for a colour. Canada Geese honked overhead. I ambled home across the city, the aroma of beautiful foods drifted enticingly. People hustled and bustled about the square: skateboards clattered as youngsters performed amazing jumps and twists. It was colourful and vibrant, a splendid example of the kingdom of this world.

'My kingdom is not of this world', said Jesus. The word translated 'of' (ἐκ, ek) conveys a sense of, *out from:* a movement from the interior outwards. His Kingdom does not come *out from* this world. We cannot lay hold of it by anything of this world. It is of a different order. So where is it found or grasped? It is found within (Lk 17.21): there is something *ungraspable and not of this world within us.* If this is the case how can we come to know or find it since all the things we use to acquire knowledge - language, thought, concept, etc - belong to this world. They are, therefore, of no use in trying to capture His Kingdom which is outside the scope and order of this world.

Jesus says that He and His Kingdom have to do with Truth. The word 'truth' ($\dot{\alpha}\lambda\dot{\eta}\theta\epsilon_{I}\alpha$, alétheia) conveys a sense of *reality* over *illusion*: reality as eternal because it is real; illusion as temporary because it is not real, *'like the grass it withers and fades'*, (1Peter: 1-24). Truth is our reality because it is His and He is found *within*: illusions are what we confuse ourselves as.

Spiritually we are a created 'centre' from whence our thoughts, ideas, feeling, emotions, etc, emanate. They may wither and fade but we remain. Our reality is the formlessness out of which forms emerge. Some call this Reality, *negative existence*; an active nothingness containing everything in potential, out of which our world emerges.

We cannot find His Kingdom because we are it. It resides in us, *as* us. We often confuse ourselves as an *effect* or *thing* of this world and fail to understand that, in God, we are the formative force *behind* the world. As king we have confused ourselves as subject. Jesus' example shows that when we are prepared to *die* to this world, His Kingdom - *our reality* - will emerge.
