What to include:

- An explanation of what the Sistine Chapel is.
- Select any 3 pieces of art in the Sistine Chapel and add them to your document.
- Annotate the pieces of art explaining what they are about



Religion & law



A study of how religions have impacted country laws.

Choose from:

- Christianity & western world
- Judaism & Israel
- Islam and Sharia law

Task:

Research and write an explanation of how the religion you have chosen has affected the laws of countries.





Religion & conflict



Examining the role of religion in conflicts.

Choose from:

- Crusades
- Northern Irish Conflict
- Arab Israeli conflict

Task: Create an information poster about one of the above conflicts.


What to include:
