#### **Year 11 GCSEs**

Whilst we have had some Year 11 final exams and assessments already, the main GCSE exam period begins in earnest on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> May. This weekend the school hall will be set up for exams for the coming weeks all the way through until the end of June (the first time this has happened for public exams since 2019!).

When Year 11 pupils are not in exams, they will be following their normal timetable and revising for forthcoming GCSEs. The scheduled revision sessions before school, at lunchtime and after school will continue as normal. We'd like to wish all of our Year 11 pupils the very best of luck as they start 'exam season'!

We will also be reminding all pupils of the need for them to be silent as they move around the parts of school in close proximity to the school hall. The lunch sessions will also be changed to accommodate longer exams in the afternoon. Times will be displayed for pupils on the screen in the canteen area; Year 9-11 will be the first lunch sitting, Yr7 & 8 will be the second lunch sitting.

### **Homework Reminder**

All homework at St Joseph's is set via Satchel One (formerly known as SMHW). All pupils at school have an account, and as parents and carers, you too have access to the platform which enables you to see what homework is being set and deadlines for the homework. We also offer a HW club after school on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays for an hour in one of our computer rooms. If you would like your child to attend, please email <a href="mailto:rro@sjcs.org.uk">rro@sjcs.org.uk</a>.

We monitor HW completion weekly and where we spot patterns of pupils not completing HW we have a supportive intervention system in place. Initially, form tutors will engage with the pupils and parents if necessary. If there is still no improvement, Directors of Learning engage with the pupil and parents and a period of close monitoring of HW completion via a HW report before the final stage of intervention with SLT where HW club becomes compulsory for pupils struggling to complete HW of their own volition.

# **End of Year Exams**

As with GCSEs, this year will also be the first year since 2019 that we will be in a position to run our normal end of year exam programme. Next week pupils will be given details on when the exam window will be, how the exams will happen, and how to prepare. For **Year 7-9** all end of year exams will be classroom based and a revision booklet will be produced to help the pupils revise for their exams.

Due to this Year's GCSE exam timetable being much longer than previous years (a measure put in pace due to covid), we will not be able to hold **Year 10** mock GCSEs in the School Hall this summer (the last GCSE exam is during Year 10 work experience week). However, Year 10 will be completing assessments in class prior to going on work experience and will have a GCSE mock exam period in September and again in January.
