Following the death of Her Majesty the Queen, as you will know, we are now into a period of national mourning that will continue until the end of the day of the State Funeral on Monday 19 September 2022.

Students have continued to attend school as normal throughout this period of national mourning and reflection and we have been holding assemblies to commemorate the life of Her Majesty. This week Mr Bazen has been focusing on the value of Faithfulness' and exploring the commitment to her duty that the late Queen showed throughout her remarkable 70 years as our sovereign. Students have been asked to reflect upon what they are called to do and how they can use their talents for the good of others.

Please note that now that it has been announced that Monday 19 September will be the funeral of the Queen, this has been declared a bank holiday and all schools will be closed as a mark of respect.

School reopens on Tuesday 20 September at the normal time.

Many of you will join in the period of reflection and silence this Sunday night at 8pm. In school, we will mark this moment this Friday morning at 9:00am when Mr Blaho will lead a short reflection with the school observing two minutes silence.
