

## ST TERESA ©N PREFERENTIAL OPTION FOR THE POOR

St Teresa founded the order
The Missionaries of Charity, to
look after abandoned babies
and to help the poorest of the
poor, once saying that they
"lived like animals but die like
angels". In 1979 she received the
Nobel Peace Prize and after her
death was canonised as Saint
Teresa.



Mother Teresa believed that poor people were great people because **she saw their poverty as a form of strength**. In her eyes, the poor had to endure immense suffering and struggle just to survive each day, yet they managed to maintain their dignity and kindness.

## ST FRANCIS ON STEWARDSHIP

The patron saint of the environment, St Francis is known for his ministry to the poor and underprivileged, his care for nature and animals, and founding the Franciscan order.




The Pope reminds us that the work of healing comes through care for the Earth just like Saint Francis has done himself. The Pope says: "As stewards of God's creation, we are called to make the earth a beautiful garden for the human family. When we destroy our forests, ravage our soil and pollute our seas, we betray that noble calling." ## ST MARGARET ©N SOLIDARITY AND SUBSIDIARITY

St. Margaret is primarily recognized for risking her life by harbouring and maintaining priests. She provided two chambers, one adjoining her house and, with her house under surveillance, she rented a house some distance away, where she kept priests hidden and Mass was celebrated through the thick of the persecution.

### St Joseph's Way!



As a pupil at St Joseph's, I am member of a unique community. I understand that I have a right to a first-class education, and have a responsibility to ensure that my classmates also receive a first-class education.

The St Joseph's Way is what sets us aside as a school. It helps me to understand why we do the things we do, and to ensure we can all thrive in a first-class learning environment.

- Start lessons well: Line up, full uniform, stand behind desks, equipment out, respect reflection.
- Take my seat, title, date, starter & retrieval immediately.
- Join in the learning: I will respond to questions when cold-called, volunteer answers when I can, and vote when requested.
- One voice: There's only one voice speaking at one time. This way, we all learn.
- Silent work is good for me: It's a chance to show what I have learnt and helps everyone to focus.
- Extend my learning: I will always push myself to extend my learning and access the challenge tasks when I can.
- Plenaries help me recall my learning and help my teacher to plan for the next lessons.
- Homework is good for me: It's my chance to show what I have learnt and to practise my skills.
- Sharing ideas helps me to learn from my peers. I'll use a partner voice if in pairs and a group voice in larger groups.
- Work is completed to MY best ability.
  - Assessments and feedback are essential for helping my progress; my teacher feeds back to me what I need to do to improve and I act on it with my MRIs.
  - YOLO You Only Learn Once: This is a myth! I know reviewing and revisiting my learning helps it stick in my long-term memory.
