From Father Anthony

I sat on my ancient Swedish recliner its green leather torn, battered and scuffed but very comfortable. A cool breeze snaked through the open window and curled round my ears. A candle flickered, tea steamed, rosary beads lay spent. I listened to the birds and gazed out of the window. Like the dome of an oyster shell the sky held a single twinkling star; blazing red clouds drifted over rooftops as the sun struggled to get above the horizon. Then, squawking and scraping, two Gangsters slid down the church roof, wings flapping, feet dancing, beaks pecking; a furious row!

Jesus explains how to deal with someone whom we feel has sinned against us... but not like the two jackdaws! The wider context is forgiveness and denying oneself. From a spiritual perspective, where there is a rich sense of *self* there is something that can be offended; the *little ego* feels it has been trespassed against; injury is felt, retribution sought, amendment demanded. This is a felt reality for most of humanity. But we are not called to be the rest of humanity: the flock being lectured to by unhealed healers, dictated to by leaders who cannot live the message they preach, jurist who heap burdens upon people but never lift a finger to ease the burden; in short, the whole wide self-interested plane of hypocrisy that underpins most of social life. We are not called to be the flock; we are called to be the shepherds. For that we must have internalised and made real a deeper message of Jesus. We must have reached a place in our own being where *we are not* but where God is. This is picking up one's cross; denying one's self. This is the place from where we truly see our brother or sister and the world we live in; the place where we see beyond *what presents*, to the Face of God behind: from which all emerges. *We give beforehand: we for-give.*

A consequence of this is that it frees us from *binding* in our self the effects of the sin we feel done against us and the dysfunctional stress this brings; we *loose* it, because we have gone beyond the self. We can still correct another for their sake and for the sake of the society we live in; but not because *little me* is offended... we are not there; God is.

THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS THURSDAY 14 SEPTEMBER

The cross is today the universal image of Christian belief. Countless generations of artists have turned it into a thing of beauty to be carried in procession or worn as jewellery. To the eyes of the first Christians, it had no beauty. It stood outside too many city walls, decorated only with decaying corpses, as a threat to anyone who defied Rome's authority - including Christians who refused sacrifice to Roman gods.

SPUC PETITION:

SPUC (The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children) will be holding a Petition Day next weekend 16/17 September. SPUC wants a world where abortion is unthinkable, and is raising awareness of the widespread problem of abortion coercion. The petition calls for the Prime Minister to end the Government's unacceptable funding of China's totalitarian state. The Chinese state imposes forced abortion, sterilisation and infanticide on its own population, notably the Uyghur minority. According to the Chief Commissioner of the Independent Commission for Aid Impact, the UK Government sent over £60 million to China in 2020-21. Please sign the petition to help SPUC defend unborn babies, and their mothers, by highlighting this terrible human rights abuse.
