From Father Anthony

Perched on the Holly stump the Gunslinger sang his little heart out, red breast dazzling like the early morning sun. He was rewarded with choicest bird seed. I sipped tea. Mrs Cat had gone... unimpressed by bird seed! The Brown Sparrows took an early morning bath. They fluttered their wings and sprayed golden droplets of water everywhere: then went to a patch of lawn and started pecking. I offered them seed: they ignored me!

Parables about the Kingdom of Heaven continue. Let's remind ourselves: The 'Kingdom', 'is found within' and 'is not of this world'. There is something not of this world within or about us. The parable speaks directly to this. Christ is its King, Christ within. He is not an intellectual exercise or a book to be read, but a real, living, tangible, experience that marvellously changes our lives. The experience is described as being like a wedding feast celebration... spirit wedded to the world, within.

A feast of spiritual gifts is ours for the taking. However, the parable makes clear that many are not interested, don't care or don't understand. Instead, we worry about money, jobs, houses, cars, education, status, promotion, governments, corporations, banks: all the things and events of this world. We fail to see that these are symptoms, not causes: that, the cause is the spiritual state from which they originate. If our lives are a mess or leave much to be desired; this is directly related to our spiritual state.

If this seems unintelligible or fanciful it may be that we have not grown and developed the *'spiritual organs'* with which to perceive things of the Spirit. Just as we develop physical senses so we need to grow and develop *spiritual senses*... mainly through prayer and various practices.

Chief among the practices is *awareness:* that aspect of our being with which we see *(understand)* through observation. To repeat from last week: awareness can illuminate our thinking, feeling and doing, against *conscience. Also,* because God is in everything, we can try to see some good in and remain open to, every situation - which is not the same as following everything! Blended together, these are initial practices which help form our spiritual senses.

The areas to begin with are the broken, unconditioned aspects of our nature ("Go out to the highways"): they are less rigid and dogmatic and more receptive to the 'invitations of Love'.
