How did civilisation grow in Britain before 1066?

Students examine how civiliisation grew from prehistory, up to the Anglo-Saxons. We consider key developments such as the Neolithic revolution and the Roman occupation.



Did the Normans bring a 'truckload of trouble' to England?

Students examine the claimants to the throne in 1066 and the events that played out. We then explore how the Normans impacted England.



How did Medieval rulers navigate power?

Students examine the success of global Medieval rulers, from the Angevin rulers of England, to wider examples of Jadwiga of Poland, Mansa Musa and Genghis Khan.



What was the impact of war, disease and revolt on 14th century England?

Students examine life in the 14th century through the lens of religion, daily life, the Black Death, Peasant's Revolt and Hundred Years War.



What can sources reveal about Medieval African Kingdoms?

Students examine Medieval West African case studies on the Kingdoms of Mali, Songhai, Benin and Asante.

An examination of some of the major events of the Second World War including Dunkirk, D-Day and Hiroshima.



Why do genocides happen?

An examination of genocides and why they happen including a study of the Holocaust and the Rwandan genocide.



Is there a solution to terrorism?

An examination into acts of terror in the 20th & 21st century including the troubles in Ireland and 9/11.

Britain: migration, empire and the people KS3/KS4 link lessons

An examination of how Britain became a multicultural nation. Exploring British identity and recognising the impact of the British Empire on the wider world.

Black & British

An examination of black people's struggles against injustices in Britain in the 20th Century and how black British people have shaped many aspects of contemporary Britain, politically, culturally and socially.

Migration: Conquered and Conquerors

An examination of how the identity of the people of Britain has been shaped by invasions and conquests during the medieval period.



Migration: Looking West

An examination of the impact of the slave trade on Britain and the consequences of British colonization. Identifying reasons for migration to and from Britain during the 17th century.

Migration: Expansion & Empire

An examination of the impact of British expansion of India and Africa during the 19th century. Identifying reasons for migration to and from Britain during the 19th century.



Migration: Britain in the 20th century

An examination of the impact of the first and second world wars, Suez; nationalism and independence in India and Africa. Investigating the legacy of empire 'Windrush' and Caribbean migrants and Britain's relationship with Europe including the Cold War, membership of the European Union and Brexit.

Transformation of the Cold War

An examination of the Berlin Wall, tensions over Cuba, the Prague Spring and the easing of tension.

Elizabeth's court and Parliament

An examination of Elizabeth I and her court: background and character of Elizabeth I; court life, including patronage; key ministers. 2

Life in Elizabethan Times

An examination of the 'Golden Age': living standards and fashions; growing prosperity and the rise of the gentry; the Elizabethan theatre and its achievements; attitudes to the theatre.

Troubles at home and abroad

An examination of Religious matters: the question of religion, English Catholicism and Protestantism and Mary Queen of Scots. Plots against Elizabeth and the Spanish Armada.



Historic environment of Elizabethan England

The study of the historic environment will focus on a particular site in its historical context and should examine the relationship between a specific place and associated historical events and developments.
