From Father Anthony

Absent without leave over Christmas, the gunslinger finally made an appearance. He puffed out his little red breast and told me off with a beautiful song. I think he was blaming me for the recent weather! Off he flitted. The garden looked old and dishevelled: bare bones and sparse matted hair. But, down in one corner a bush sparkled in watery sunlight with pink, mauve and white buds. Along the wintery path of death and decay it seemed to herald a new road to life and spring.

Last week we spoke of spiritual Intuition leading us, like a star, away from the tired, old manipulating ways of the world *(Herod):* along a new path to finding Christ within, our spiritual soul *(Epiphany)*. Innate wisdom lays down its gifts before our spiritual soul: the riches of spirit (Gold); the beauty of spirit (Frankincense): the eternity of spirit (Myrrh). Using these 'gifts' we grow and transform. There is no going back to former ways as we begin the transformation from an *animated soul* to a *life-giving spirit*. But, we need more than Intuition. We need a teacher and guide.

Spiritual Intuition leads us to Christ within. The most complete manifestation of Christ is Jesus. Our awakening spiritual soul *(John)* will point Him out. We must now tread the path of Jesus and follow Him as our teacher and guide. A new relationship is formed. He the teacher *(Teacher, Rabbi):* we the learners (disciple, mathētḗs, µαθητής, means, *'one who learns by instruction from another'*). Now we really become His disciples.

Following is one thing; living where He lives in Himself, spiritually, is another. We must find out where He lives (*'where do you live?'*)... not referring to houses, streets or countries; but, where do you live within your being. His reply will be... *'be you coming and be you perceiving'*. He invites us into His own spiritual soul. The Gospel says the disciples stayed with him the whole day. So must we. Very often *'night and day'*, refers to an unfolding spiritual process where night is *ignorance* and day *understanding*. The disciples stayed with Him *that day*, i.e. until they understood. Understood what? They stayed until the tenth hour. The tenth letter is also a hand in Hebrew (*yod*). It represents our unformed consciousness out of which creative thought forms emerge. They stayed until they could think and create like God. So must we!
