# ORDINARY TIME WEEK 11(B)

### From Father Anthony

The Brown Sparrows flitted from branch to branch; the Gunslinger eyed me from the stump and Gangsters circled above cawing rudely. I sipped tea under an overcast sky. The garden was thick with growth; vines stretched along the side of the church, leaning across the path. Pink and red roses blushed sedately; daisies bobbed in uncut grass! Chirping loudly a mother called to her chick who hopped over to be fed.

"With many such parables He spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it". A parable casts light or understanding on a particular truth. The truth this week is about the Kingdom of God. It is experienced as small to begin with (a seed) but becomes massive; it is not of our making (how it grows we do not know). Elsewhere in the Gospels we learn that it is found within. There is something small within each of us that is not of our making that can become massive.

Our lives are the 'many parables'. They cast light on whether we are wedded to the kingdom of this world (outer) or the Kingdom of God (inner). As we move from preoccupation with the outer to perception of the inner (St Paul) we recognise that it is in our inner life that He 'scatters' the seed of His Kingdom and 'speaks the word to us'... in order to feed us. Awareness and observation through prayer, inner listening and meditation are tools through which we hear Him and experience His Kingdom within. How He operates or how the Kingdom grows within we do not know - it is not of our making. As we take our awareness and attention away from the worldly kingdom (unnecessary distractions and preoccupations) we learn to focus on the interior, the Divine Kingdom within. The difference between the two kingdoms is felt as conscience and it is this we must listen to and follow.

Attempts to change the outside world and all its many 'mechanisms' are misdirected. The outside world only reflects our inner world. If the world is a mess, it reflects our individual and collective inner mess: hence, 'Seek ye first the kingdom of God'. We do not create the Kingdom of God but, it needs our awareness of and cooperation with it for it to be reflected in the world. Then He will take us aside and reveal deeper meanings.
