From Father Anthony

I stood outside with my thoughts for company and a mug of tea. An early morning blackbird greeted the day: clouds drifted. The garden is almost asleep. Most of the leaves have fallen and litter the path: hollyhocks have gone, vines, like the author, are bald and what was once vibrant, colourful and alert is now resigned, dull and droopy. It may seem sad and lamentable yet the coming of winter also brings thoughts of the delights of spring which will soon follow. During the death of winter, life will germinate; nature will prepare herself for a new bloom.

"In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken". The Gospel passage, in context, refers to the fall of the Temple: it also refers to you and me. Most people have their ups and downs, their horrors and catastrophes, their depressions and lamentations. And it is never a nice experience. But, to the wiser mind, these are like gongs sounding; loud calls to read the signs of our personal interior times. We are created to love God and one another. Not just as an academic or ideological exercise... but for real! This is the point of creation... to love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your mind etc, and your neighbour as yourself. If we are not engaged in this, for real, we miss the mark (sin). No wonder we suffer because, we are not doing what we were created to do. Once this is seen and understood, in mind and heart, winter changes to spring: the Son of Man comes on the clouds of our lives and in His face we see our reflection, our family resemblance to the Creator, Our Father, God.

If we are already experiencing the coldness of Advent; remember the warmth of the infant Jesus is to come. If we see, beyond the conspiracy theorist, a world seemingly spinning out of control we are seeing the consequences of a world that has taken its eyes of God and deified itself instead. This seeing and understanding is everything if it engenders spiritual action. No need for accusations and alarm; no need for blame. But, a great need for a *change of mind and heart*.


