THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

The distant headland reclined along the horizon and dipped into the sea. Cloud met water like candy-floss on a grey plate. The background sky was blue and yellow. Waves rolled in with long sighs; they slapped and gurgled playfully around the rocks. Desultory figures ambled along the promenade: dogs scampered and barked. 'Northern' gangsters eyed me from the sea rail; gulls chattered and hovered in anticipation of a morsel or two... and were not disappointed. Having performed this morning ritual I returned for tea.

Last week the adult Jesus returned to Galilee. This week, after His ritual presentation in the Temple we learn of His first return to Galilee as a child with His parents, on their way home to Nazareth from Jerusalem. This tells us something about Jesus. Galilee unlike orthodox Jerusalem was 'gentileridden': it was shunned and bypassed by orthodox Jews. Yet, this is where Jesus, the Second Person of the Trinity (God) decided to grow up... in an obscure, possibly despised, little village called Nazareth ("can anything good come out of Nazareth' - Jn 6). As the second reading observes "... he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every way, that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest before God to expiate the sins of the people". As a child He grew up among mixed races, mixed bloodlines and the 'unclean': as an adult He will keep company with prostitutes, tax collectors and sinners. Does this not assure us that as God with us (Emmanuel) He is at home in the temple of our being: especially the areas that are obscure, perhaps despised and definitely sinful? He has become as we are: now we must become as He is.

To understand this we must follow His journey interiorly; we must return to Nazareth in Galilee. Spiritually, Galilee refers to our minds and Nazareth means watchtower, i.e. we must keep watch over our minds. Like Mary we must purify ourselves - reject what is not of God - so that what remains is God; we become mother to God. With Jospeh we must increase in spiritual awareness (Joseph means increaser) and buy back (redeem) from the slavery of sin what has remained lost or hidden... Jesus within us: and become father to Jesus within. Then, all who meet us, like Simeon and Anna, will recognise God in us; and experience the reality of Jesus through us.

IMPORTANT - MASS CHANGES THIS SUNDAY 2 FEBRUARY

Due to unavailability of priests, there will be a one-off change to our normal Sunday Mass schedule this Sunday 2 February. Our regular 9am Mass at St Gregory will take place at 11am (in St Gregory's Church) and there will be NO 11am Mass at St Osmund on this day ONLY.

The revised Mass schedule on Sunday will be:

9am St Osmund, 11am St Gregory, 12.30pm Ordinariate St Osmund and 6pm St Osmund. If you know anyone who only attends occasionally that may not be aware, please let them know. **Confessions** this Saturday (1 Feb) at St Osmund will take place after the 10am Mass only.

THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD (CANDLEMAS)

'When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord," and to offer the sacrifice of "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons," in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord'.
