THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

From Father Anthony

I threaded my way along the A36 from Warminster back to Salisbury. It was Christmas day morning: drab, cold, with very fine rain. Thick clouds boiled and twisted above the undulating countryside. Then, away to my right the clouds parted and, for an extended moment, emitted a shaft of intense golden sunlight. It lit up a hillock which blazed a deep emerald green. It was unexpected, spectacular and heart lifting. I couldn't help thinking that the heavens were doing homage to the ground in memory of the Birth of Jesus. Or am I being fanciful?

They prostrated themselves and did him homage. With the Birth of Jesus, God makes Himself accessible to all of us by becoming one of us. God becomes part of His own creation! God and man now have family resemblance. He is a demanding God: demanding our love and care... as all babies do! Normally we relax in love; but even more so with a defenceless, vulnerable infant. In ordinary speak we have to be on the lookout for them, all the time; anticipating their wants and needs; trying to see the world from their perspective... a definition of selfless love (Agape). Parents know this... especially at three in the morning!

And yet, the unknown and unknowable God manifests in this Infant. In the Presence of this Child (*Jesus*), we are in the Presence of God. And being in the Presence of God the sensitive soul is awe struck and deeply moved to worship and do homage. Perhaps, in an increasingly secular, materialistic society we are becoming less reverent and worshipful. But, when we cease to be present to God we begin to worship and idolise ourselves; we become self-obsessed and self-preoccupied, which leads to the torment of seeking for what can never be found: and ultimately to a form of oblivion.

The gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh were diplomatic gifts of tribute acknowledging a rightful heir... much has been written about this. Practically, there are three gifts we can offer to Jesus as He manifests His Presence to us (*Epiphany*). Firstly, acknowledge Him and come into His Presence, like the Kings did. Secondly, love Him with affection: don't leave Him outside our life or our society. Thirdly, worship Him as God, above ourselves, others and any worldly power we have established. There is only one King, one Ruler, one God; all others are fake.

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

In the Eastern Church the major feast is that of the Epiphany, which focuses on Matthew's story of the coming of the Wise men to honour Jesus with gifts. The heart of this feast lies in the revelation of Christ to the non-Jewish world represented by the Magi. It recognises the stages of God's showing himself to the world, first to the Jewish people and then, through the Jewish Jesus, to all people. Epiphany Chalk - The blessing of homes with Epiphany Chalk is a centuries old Catholic tradition. The chalk will be blessed by the priests at Mass this Sunday. Families can then take a piece home and use it to bless their homes. The chalk is used to write an inscription over the front door, to invoke God's blessing and protection on all who enter the house. If you want to take home some blessed chalk, you can pick up a piece along with a prayer slip with instructions from the stewards at the back after each Mass.
