From Father Anthony

I wrapped up warm and sat in the garden surrounded by the greens and yellows of ivy and privet. Sparrows chattered loudly: gulls circled and swooped with indignant cries. The sea air was icy but delightfully fresh: winter sun warmed my face. I sipped mint tea and watched contrails, as passenger jets unzipped the deep blue sky on their way to Shannon and thence across the Atlantic. I said a prayer for their safe descent and landing.

"And having descended with them He stood on level ground..." Jesus had been praying all night on the mountain, had then called his disciples and, from among them, chosen twelve apostles. The spiritual nature of this event is indicated by the mountain, a metaphor for spirit. The importance of prayer is also indicated; it is in prayer that Jesus is met. We meet Him first as learners (disciples): when we are ready, He might choose us as Apostles – and send us into the world to proclaim His Name and His Message. Whether Disciple or Apostle another important aspect of Jesus' spiritual teaching is that we must descend from the heights of Spirit and ground what we learn in the world - Jesus came down... stood on level ground. Level ground is good for growing crops: it is also a place where people can meet. We must ground what we learn in spirit, and make it available to others, for our mutual growth.

The Message we learn is not some human thinking, some human message (cursed be the one who trusts in human beings). It is the Word of God! It will be a stumbling block to some (1 Cor 1:23). It will seem to be full of contradictions... when you are poor you are rich, when weak strong, and so on (the Beatitudes). But, it is the only message that soothes the human heart and makes sense to our spiritual nature. Many, burdened by the world (Tyre and Sidon), are desperate to hear it. The word of man - the corporate world, governments, human institutions and so on - fails us miserably; it takes our money, burdens our hearts and leads us nowhere.

We are named after Christ and we are to become like Him; which means spending time with Him in prayer, internalising and understanding His message... so that we might pass it on to the world. But, do we do this?
