From Father Anthony

A light mist covered the sea with tinges of deep blue promising a beautiful day. A gull moaned eerily. Waves crashed and retreated over pebbles with the sound of applause. Two fishing boats bobbed in and out of the mist. A fisherman stood precariously against the swell, hauling in his nets.

The net can be a metaphor for how we gather worldly information that should lead to spiritual understanding. However, what we mostly experience is a sense of darkness or incomprehension. We adapt and mend our nets; we pray, meditate, study, think and attempt understanding; and are left with darkness. Our understanding, our thinking, etc, is the darkness; this darkness cannot get past itself into the light - 'and the light in the darkness shines and the darkness couldn't comprehend it' (Jn1:5).

If the boat represents our being in the world and the net how we gather information; if what we catch leaves us with a sense of nothing, with no spiritual understanding (caught nothing all night), perhaps our nets need washing, i.e. repentance; a change of mind and heart. Our minds and hearts need cleansing; they have become dirty and torn from trying to catch the wrong things in the wrong places. Which, of course, leaves us frustrated.

There is good and bad news. The bad news is that on our own we cannot comprehend the light that shines in the darkness; we cannot make the transition from physical to spiritual sight on our own. For that we need a particular Guest in the boat of our life... Jesus. This is the good news because... He is the Good News. Only Jesus can dispel the darkness in our lives and reveal the light beyond because, He is the Light.

Jesus resides in the boat of our lives always asking us to put out from the shore. But, do we listen... with the ears of our soul - Simon means to hear. If we listen and push out from the shore of our habitual life our earth, bound by worldly thinking and feeling He will teach the multitude of our thoughts and feelings and help us to understand. Then we can put out into the deeper water of soul and gain spiritual understanding (many fish). We will recognise Him in and as our life. Insofar as others recognise and are attracted to Him, in us, we become fishers of men.
